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Community + Service

- Ceramics students made bowls for the annual Empty Bowl collaboration with Community Service.
- AP Studio Art and Ceramics 2 students participated in a joint art exhibit with Northwestern University's Science & Society organization. ETHS students created visual responses and used imagery from NU scientists as inspiration for their own original work.
- Graphics Club created shirts, posters, etc. for Graduation, Senior Scholarship committee, and ETHS Garden Walk.
- Visual Arts hosted the annual District 65/202 show and Open House.
- Music Technology students used their music composition/technical skills to compose music for residents at Glen Oaks Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Glenview.

Community + Service

- Photography 1 and S.T.A.R.S students collaborated with the Students Without Borders club, English Language Learners (ELL), and South Asian Middle Eastern Alliance students to create the “Where I’m From” exhibition showcasing ETHS student family origin and immigration stories.
- S.T.A.R.S. and D.S.T.M. students collaborated to host Doughnuts at the Palace, an event welcoming the student body into their classroom, displaying a space that promotes social, emotional, learning and life success skills.
- ETHS Marching Band performed at Boosterpalooza.
- ETHS Jazz performed at the ETHS Foundation’s annual Evening of Appreciation, as well as a performance for the Class of ’68 Reunion.
- Speech and Debate students coached two middle school debate programs and served as judges in the Illinois Middle School Debate League.



Awards + Accomplishments

- Over 2 million dollars in scholarships for art school were awarded to senior art students.
- 17 ETHS students participated in the 2019 Illinois High School Art Exhibition (IHSAE), showcasing work in the General and/or Senior Scholarship Exhibitions. 14 students were selected for the Senior Scholarship Exhibition, with each student receiving at least one scholarship.
- 54 students had their work chosen to be exhibited in the CSL Art Exhibit.
- 32 pieces of student artwork were awarded a Scholastic Art & Writing Award .
- 27 student films were featured in the 2nd annual ETHS Film Festival across four categories: live action, animated short, experimental film, and documentary feature
- 32 senior art students participated in the annual Senior Showcase exhibit
- Wind Symphony performed at 2019 Music for All National Concert Band Festival in Indianapolis.
- Wind Symphony performed at the 2019 Superstate Concert Band Festival and was named Honor Band.
- Marching Band won Grand Champion award at the Marengo Settlers Day Competition.
- Speech team placed top 50 in Original Oratory and Top 10 in Oratorical Declamation at Nationals.
- Speech and debate students reached elimination rounds at Emory and Harvard.

- Graphics 2 and 3 students collaborated with the Algebra and Entrepreneurship class designing Wildkit gear for the school store.
- Martin Ayala, former Toy designer, visited our S.T.A.R.S. class and talked with them about developing leadership skills and personal/professional qualities that leaders exhibit.
- In an effort to embrace conflict resolution at E.T.H.S., our D.S.T.M. students designed conflict resolution cards.
- Our S.T.A.R.S. students attended "A Christmas Carol", as we continued to discover connections between leadership and the power of choice.
- Symphonic Band spent a day in performance workshops and clinics at Elmhurst College.
- Symphonic Band had an exchange workshop with Erica Nideling from DePaul University with Niles West High School Symphonic Band.
- Wind Symphony spent a day at Illinois State University in performance workshops and clinics.
- Jazz Ensemble performed at the Chicago Jazz Showcase.
- Jazz program hosted the 16th Annual Jazz Festival with Chicago State University Community Jazz Band.
- Speech and Debate team traveled to eight different states; put on a Spanish-language debate; attended a series of lectures at Northwestern on critical theory and philosophy.
