

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

This executive summary identifies some of the changes, trends or patterns over the past five years. The 2011-2012 total enrollment (Part 1A) of 2974 is higher than last year's enrollment (2890) and higher than the projected enrollment for 2011-12 of 2822. Figure 1 below shows the enrollment changes over the past five years.




In the 2010-2011 school year, the federal government issued new guidelines/categories for collecting and reporting race data. The tables in this report have been reformatted in accordance with those new guidelines. Those new guidelines had an impact on the enrollments of some of the racial groups. Therefore, comparison of data prior to 2010-11 should be done with caution. Due to state reporting requirements, enrollment numbers do not include off-campus special education placements or Safe School student enrollments.


#### **Trends and Patterns**

- After four years of a gradual decrease in enrollment, overall enrollment of 2974 is at its highest since 2006-07 when overall enrollment was 3041.
- The grade 12 total enrollment is up from 2010-11 by 79 students. This is the final year of the large cohort (865) that entered ETHS in 2007 (Part 1A).
- Black or African American enrollment has declined gradually over the past five years, with a decline from last year to 30.0%, a decrease of 1.7%.
- White enrollment is up 2.3% from 2010-11 and now stands at 45.4%.
- The number of District 202 residents attending non-public schools (Part 1E) decreased to 272 from the 299 reported in 2010. Most of this decrease is attributed to lower enrollments of students attending Loyola Academy and Regina Dominican.
- With the exception of the special education and bilingual program, all of the departments showed a slight increase in enrollees (Part 2A). The math, science, and world languages departments all showed increases for the third year in a row.

- The number of students enrolled in the special education program has declined gradually over the past four years, with a decline from 369 in 2010-11 to 354 in 2011-12.
- In 2011-12, all of the departments showed a slight increase in the number of semester one sections offered (Part 2B).
