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# Executive Summary

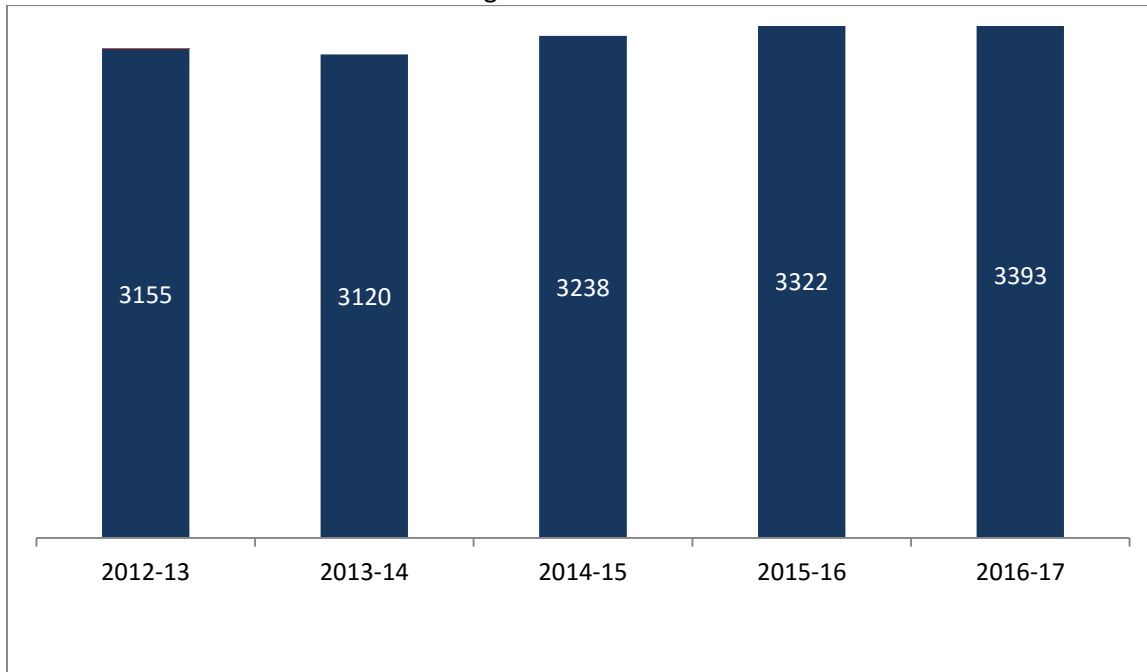
## Introduction

The following report presents the official school enrollment as of September 30, 2016. Enrollment figures are disaggregated by race/ethnicity and gender. The report also includes information on special education students attending private and public facilities, District 202 residents attending non-public schools, class enrollment by department, number of class sections by department, average class size by department, and special courses and programs.

## Total Enrollment

The 2016-2017 total enrollment (Part 1A) of 3393 is the highest enrollment over last thirty years. The chart below shows the enrollment changes over the last five years.

Beginning in 2016-2017, official district/school enrollment counts included students attending the ALT School. First time grade 9 enrollments in 2016-2017 is at its highest (837) since 2004-2005 (Part 1B).

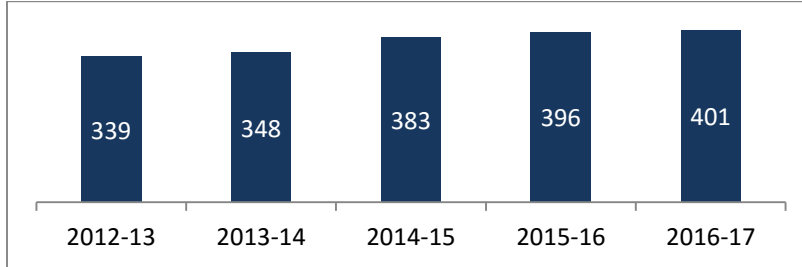
## Enrollment by Department

All departments (career & technical education, fine arts, history/social sciences, mathematics, physical education and wellness, science, special education and world languages) except English/reading increased enrollment in 2016-17 (Part 2A). The history/social sciences department increased for the fifth year in a row, and the physical education and wellness department increased for the fourth year in a row. The mathematics and science departments increased enrollments for the third year in a row. The enrollments in all departments are higher than in 2012-13.

### Enrollment in Special Education and Bilingual Program

The number of students enrolled in the special education program increased from 396 in 2015-2016 to 401 in 2016-2017. In 2016-17 there 67 students enrolled in the bilingual program, which is twice the number of student enrolled in 2012-13 (29).

### Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity

Total student enrollment by race/ethnicity over the past five years is summarized in the table below.

The percentage of Black/African American students is 29.8% in 2016-2017, compared to 30.2% in 2015-2016. The proportion of Black/African American students has remained relatively steady for the past five years. The proportion of Hispanic/Latino students has increased from 17.7% in 2016-2017 compared to 15.4% in 2012-2013, which is the highest in ETHS history. The proportion of White students increased to 44.1% in 2016-17 compared to 43.2% in 2015-2016. The proportion of Asian students increased in 2016-17 to 5.5%, which is the highest in ETHS history. The proportion of students identified as Two or More Races declined in 2016-17 to 2.4%, compared to 5.2% in 2012-13.
