

Our goal is for every student to develop a broader awareness of self and the breadth of opportunities available to them after high school. Simply put, we want students to feel confident about what they will do and how they will do it after graduation from ETHS.

Our Post High School Planning Philosophy

Awareness, Access and Success

Awareness requires *knowing* college and employer expectations.

Access requires *doing* the necessary things to be prepared to reach your goals.

Success will be attained when you are college and career ready.





Post-High School Options

Apprenticeship: Typically paid career training in skilled trades.

<u>Trade/Career School:</u> Education concentrated on preparing students for work in their chosen career field.

2 Year College/Community College: Earn an *Associate's degree* with an option to transfer to a four-year college or earn a *License or Career Certificate*.

4 Year College/University: Earn a *Bachelor's degree* in a wide spectrum of interest areas.

<u>Full Time Work:</u> Work an average of 30 hours per week or more at one employer.

<u>Military Service</u>: Time spent serving in the U.S. Armed Forces in a career determined by the *ASVAB* (*Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery*).

Gap Year Programs: A semester or year of service and/or enrichment between high school and college.

<u>Transition Services:</u> Continued instruction in education, employment/training and independent living skills for eligible students with IEPs.
















ICAPs May Include






SchooLinks Step 1: Personality Profile







- Get involved / get more involved




Major Takeaways
